- 2. Test on time
- 3. Display your disc
- 4. Review maintenance systems







Legal Requirements

- Vehicle owners must
 - Ensure vehicles are roadworthy FIX BEFORE USE
 - Ensure vehicles are tested on time
 - Implement a system for regular inspection and maintenance of vehicles
 - · Periodically review it
 - Make any changes required to ensure it is effective
 - Ensure inspection frequency takes account of vehicle condition, age and mileage, manufacturers guidelines etc
 - Ensure inspections are carried out by suitably qualified persons
 - Ensure drivers are trained to carry out vehicle walkaround checks, record & notify defects
 - Ensure defects get repaired
 - Keep records
 - Make an annual declaration to the RSA



vehicles inspected at roadside










Roadworthiness roadside compliance 2018 - 2020











Defects detected roadside 2018 - 2020










Common Defects – Axles, wheels, tyres & suspension












Common Defects – Braking equipment












Top 10 infringements detected at roadworthiness premises inspections in 2020











Most frequently detected infringements at roadside tachograph & licensing inspections in 2020











Most frequently detected infringements at premises tachograph & licensing inspections in 2020

Top 10 infringements - MSIs, VSIs & SIs





Most frequently prosecuted infringements from Tachograph & Licensing <u>roadside and premises</u> inspections in 2020










Safer Drivers Compliance with Drivers' Hours & Working Time Rules









Driver Essentials

- Drivers licence
- Current driver CPC
- Driver card tachograph
- Equipment training
- Walkaround check training
- Medical Fitness to Drive









Working conditions – the Rules

- Drivers Hours (summary)
 - 45 min break after 4.5 hrs
 - Daily driving time limited to 9hrs
 - Weekly driving time limited to 56 hrs
 - 11 hrs rest in each 24 hour period
 - Weekly rest of 45 hrs to be taken after 6*24 hr periods
- Working Time
 - 60 hrs max per week or 48 hrs averaged over a 17 week period









Employer Responsibilities

Ensure

- Drivers have only one and use only their own driver card
- Tachograph equipment is working and calibrated
- Drivers know how to use the tachograph equipment
- Drivers know how to use the mode switch mechanism
- Downloads are carried out, records analysed and records kept
- Drivers are asked to produce records for other work done
- If rules are broken, it is documented along with remedial actions








Employer Responsibilities Continued

Ensure

- Vehicles are stated on operators licence (where required)
- Journeys are planned and sufficient time is afforded to drivers for
 - Traffic congestion
 - Roadworks
 - Bad weather
 - Daily living
 - Delays etc.











Remember Chain of Responsibility

As an employer you must ensure:

- contractually agreed time schedules with consignors comply with rules on Driving Times, Breaks and Rest Periods
- drivers are not encouraged to breach these rules and are not incentivised to do so









Consequences for Non Compliance – Vehicle Maintenance Requirements

Fines and Penalty Points

Failing to comply with Vehicle Maintenance & Repair Regulations	Court appearance attracting a €5,000 (Class A) fine and/or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months on conviction
Driving vehicle before remedying dangerous defect	Mandatory court appearance attracting 3 penalty points & fine not exceeding €5,000 (Class A) on conviction
Driving dangerously defective vehicle	Mandatory court appearance attracting 5 penalty points & fine not exceeding €5,000 (Class A) on conviction
Using Commercial Vehicle without Certificate of Roadworthiness (CRW)	Mandatory court appearance attracting 5 penalty points & fine not exceeding €5,000 (Class A) on conviction







Consequences for Non Compliance – Tachograph & Drivers Hours Requirements

Fines and Penalty Points

Failing to comply with the tachograph rules / rules on Driving Times, Breaks & Rest Periods

Court appearance attracting a €5,000 (Class A) fine and/or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months on conviction
